### NEW DISASTER RECOVERY FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS (DRFA) EVENT – Severe weather and associated flooding across the South Coastal District (20-21 June 2021)

Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) has submitted a formal DRFA notification for the severe weather and associated flooding in the South Coastal District between 20-21 June 2021.

#### Event description

- On 20 June 2021, a slow-moving trough heading in an easterly direction, brought heavy rainfall over the South Coastal district of Western Australia.
- The heavy rainfall impacted road networks, power supplies and water infrastructure.
- 9000 properties were without power along the South Coast.
- The storm severely damaged both major roads (the South Coastal Highway and Lower Denmark Road) between Albany and Denmark, private homes and vehicles disrupting locals and the traveling public.
- Wind gusts of up to 100 kph and more than 100 mm of rain was recorded in some areas.
- Local SES crews reported 168 requests for assistance overnight, including structural and roof damage, trees down as well as flooding and water ingress.
- The majority of the DRFA eligible costs are expected to relate to the restoration of essential public assets.

# FACTSHEET: Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements 2018

## (Joint Australian-Western Australian Government assistance)

### Severe Weather and Associated Flooding across the South Coastal District (20-21 June 2021) V1

**\*Please note the information in this factsheet is current as at 6 July 2021 and may change\***

The Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) is a jointly funded program between the Australian Government and state and territory (state) governments, through which the Australian Government provides financial assistance to support state governments with disaster recovery costs. Eligible costs include assistance measures for individuals and families, businesses, primary producers, non-profit organisations and local and state governments.

Under these arrangements, state governments largely determine what assistance measures will be activated, and the areas in which they will be made available. The Australian Government may then reimburse state governments for up to 75 per cent of these costs. State governments are responsible for administering the DRFA assistance measures.

#### **DRFA ACTIVATED LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS**

In response to the severe weather event, DRFA assistance has been activated in the three (3) local government areas of: Albany, Denmark and Plantagenet.

#### **DRFA ASSISTANCE MEASURES (as activated by the Western Australian Government)**

##### ***Assistance for individuals***

**Emergency assistance:** This assistance helps support people who have been evacuated or who need assistance due to the disaster, to meet their immediate and basic needs. This may include food, essential clothing, and other personal items including medical and/or pharmaceutical items, access to communications, transport, and document replacement costs (e.g. birth certificate). Assistance may be provided via a one-off payment and is not income or asset tested.

**Temporary living expenses:** This assistance provides temporary accommodation of up to three weeks while a person's own accommodation is uninhabitable due to the damage or destruction caused by the disaster. This may include the provision of food and emergency transport. Assistance may be available to those who are uninsured, underinsured, or who are not yet in receipt of their insurance assistance. This assistance is not income or asset tested but considered on an as needs basis.

**Replacement of essential household contents:** This assistance supports those who are unable to return to a functioning capacity by providing help to repair or replace certain essential household items in their principal place of residence or assisting with alternative accommodation for those who are uninsured or underinsured. This assistance is considered on a case-by-case basis and is subject to income and asset testing.

**Housing repairs/replacement:** This assistance provides help with costs associated with repairing or replacing owner-occupied homes to a habitable, safe and secure condition following the disaster. Payments are subject to income and asset testing.

**Personal and financial counselling emergency assistance:** This assistance provides for individuals to access a limited number of personal (psychological) counselling sessions with a registered psychologist. This assistance is aimed at alleviating personal hardship or distress as a result of the disaster. There is no income and/or assets testing, however suitable identification is required.

**Assistance for small businesses and primary producers**

**Interest rate subsidy to small businesses and primary producers:** Assistance for small business and primary producers whose assets have been significantly damaged as a direct result of an eligible disaster (subject to certain eligibility criteria). These loans may be used to meet carry-on requirements or to repair or replace damaged property not covered by insurance.

- For small businesses, this assistance is administered by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES). To enquire about this assistance please contact DFES on (08) 9395 9341 or (08) 9395 9994.
- For primary producers, this assistance is administered by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). To enquire about this assistance please contact DPIRD on 1800 198 231.

**Freight subsidies for primary producers:** This assistance provides subsidies to assist with the transportation of emergency fodder for livestock, fodder or water for livestock and building or fencing equipment or machinery.

**Professional advice for primary producers:** Provides professional advice directly related to addressing issues arising from the cyclone and associated flooding, advice may relate to business or financial matters, hydrological or soil conservation issues, feed analysis or stock health issues.

- This assistance is administered by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). To enquire about this assistance please contact DPIRD on 1800 198 231.

**Assistance for state agencies and local governments**

**Counter Disaster Operations:** This assistance provides for costs associated with tree bracing activities and clearing up of debris from an eligible CDO activity (i.e. removal of debris from residential properties).

**Restoration of essential public assets:** This assistance helps with the costs of restoring or repairing eligible essential public assets or infrastructure damaged as a direct result of a disaster to their pre-disaster condition.

- **State Road Infrastructure Assets:** Main Roads Western Australia administers the assistance for the restoration of state road network infrastructure. ## NEW DISASTER RECOVERY FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS (DRFA) EVENT – NSW STORMS AND FLOODS (2 JANUARY 2021 ONWARDS)

Resilience NSW has submitted a formal DRFA notification for the storms and floods which occurred from 2 January 2021 onwards.

### Event description

- On 2 January 2021, a broad trough of low pressure over western NSW resulted in severe thunderstorms, including heavy rainfall, damaging winds and large hailstones.
  - There was significant damage to residences, businesses and essential public assets including lost bridges and damage to roads and culverts.
- Three helicopters were mobilised in support of the response to this event, including flood rescue, resupply and reconnaissance tasks.
  - A kayaker was reported deceased on the Tooloom Creek (Kyogle LGA) and nine flood rescues were carried out as a result of significant flooding.
- A significant and coordinated multi-agency response was required for this event.
  - As at 11 January, the NSW SES had received 1075 requests for assistance and 3050 calls to the State Operations Centre for the event.

- The NSW SES was resourced with additional staff to manage public information, planning and staffing. Additional crews were deployed across the state for flood rescue, storm and IMT personnel.

# FACTSHEET: Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements

## (Joint Australian-New South Wales government assistance)

### NSW Storms and Floods (2 January 2021 onwards)

**\*Please note the information in this factsheet is current as at 6 July 2021 and may change\***

The Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) is a jointly funded program between the Australian Government and state and territory (state) governments, through which the Australian Government provides financial assistance to support state governments with disaster recovery costs. Eligible costs include assistance measures for individuals and families, small businesses, primary producers, non-profit organisations and local and state governments.

Under these arrangements, state governments largely determine what assistance measures will be activated, and the areas in which they will be made available. The Australian Government may then reimburse state governments for up to 75 per cent of these costs. State governments are responsible for administering the DRFA assistance measures.

#### DRFA ACTIVATED LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

In response to the storms, DRFA assistance has been activated in the four (4) local government areas of: Glen Innes Severn, Narromine, Parkes and Tamworth.

#### DRFA ASSISTANCE MEASURES (as activated by the New South Wales Government)

##### Assistance for individuals

Immediate assistance: This assistance is intended to meet the essential emergency needs of people who are directly affected by the disaster and have no other means of meeting their immediate needs (such as evacuees who are unable to access their personal finances or arrange alternative forms of assistance). The assistance may be provided during and in the days after the disaster. Assistance is provided through in-kind direct material aid e.g. emergency accommodation or small cash payments to purchase essential items. Immediate assistance is generally provided from evacuation or recovery centres.

Grants for essential household contents: These grants will assist with the cost of replacing household items essential to maintaining a basic standard of living. Examples of essential household contents include bedding, furniture, clothing, and essential electrical items (e.g. refrigerator, washing machine, stove). These grants assist low-income residents, not covered by insurance, who have no other means of restoring their homes to a safe and habitable condition following the disaster event. Grants are subject to income and assets testing. The amount of assistance provided depends on the assessed needs of the affected household and the number and type of items that have been damaged.

Grants for essential structural repairs to homes: These grants provide a contribution toward essential structural repairs to low income home owners who have no other means of restoring their homes to a safe and habitable condition following the disaster event, and who are not covered by insurance. Grants are subject to income and assets testing. The amount of assistance provided depends on an assessment of structural repairs required and the number of occupants in the home.

##### Assistance for small businesses, primary producers and non-profit organisations

Concessional interest rate loans (direct damage) to small businesses and primary producers: Loans of up to \$130,000 at a fixed concessional interest rate may be available to small businesses and primary producers



(subject to certain eligibility criteria) that have been directly impacted by a disaster. These loans may be used to meet carry-on requirements or to repair or replace damaged property not covered by insurance.

- State administering agency: NSW Rural Assistance Authority

Concessional interest rate loans (direct damage) and grants to non-profit organisations:

*Assistance to sporting and recreation clubs:* A special scheme is available to assist sporting and recreation clubs in meeting the costs of restoration of essential club facilities that have been damaged or destroyed. The assistance is only made available to clubs that do not have the financial capacity to meet restoration costs from their own resources, and who are unable to obtain assistance through normal channels, but that have the capacity to repay any loan that may be granted. The maximum assistance available is \$12,000, including a grant of up to \$2,000 and the balance by way of repayable advance with interest.

- State administering agency: NSW Treasury for grant assistance

*Loans to non-profit organisations:* Loan assistance is available to voluntary non-profit organisations for the restoration of essential facilities that have been damaged or destroyed. Assistance is only available to those organisations that do not have the financial capacity to meet restoration costs from their own resources or insurance and are unable to obtain assistance through normal channels. Advances are subject to a maximum of \$25,000 at a concessional interest rate per annum.

*Freight subsidies for primary producers:* Transport freight subsidies of up to 50 per cent on the carriage of livestock and fodder, and 25 per cent on the carriage of fodder for dairy cattle, are available to help primary producers. The maximum subsidy available is \$15,000 per annum.

**Assistance for state agencies and local councils**

Counter disaster operations: This assistance helps state agencies and councils with the costs associated with delivering exceptional relief and recovery measures within impacted communities which go beyond the capacity of the state or local government. This may include activities to render damaged properties or threatened houses safe and habitable, sandbagging and the construction of temporary levees to prevent inundation of residential properties.

- State administering agency: Resilience NSW

Restoration of essential public assets: This measure provides financial assistance to help with the costs of restoring or repairing eligible essential public assets damaged as a direct result of a disaster to their pre-disaster standard.

  - For assistance to restore public roads, road infrastructure and bridges, councils should contact their regional representatives in Transport for NSW.
  - For assistance to restore other essential public assets, councils should contact their regional representatives in Public Works Advisory.

The NSW Government may also claim costs associated with certain other disaster assistance measures undertaken by state agencies and councils including the establishment and operation of evacuation and recovery centres, personal and financial counselling services, engagement of community recovery officers and debris removal from residential properties.

Hi s22 [redacted],

We have just been to meet with our community, disconnected & impacted by over sixty landslides on Araluen Road, three of which are major. We have about 18 months of work still ahead to fully reconnect this community (if it stops raining).

Their on-going trauma following on from the bushfires & 7 natural disaster floods is clear, yet the majority remain amazingly resilient. Some however clearly need on-going support for their mental, social & economic well-being, and they are being connected to receive that support wherever possible.

The impacts of the full road closures at the major landslide sites are very real and significant.

We have similar impacts all over the western part of our Eurobodalla LGA.

As your Department plays a major role in shaping policy & funding decisions, I make the following observations & requests in the hope of reshaping on-going enhancements to help build future resilience across Australia.

#### 1. NDRRA changes

The changes made to the NDRRA in terms of being able to replace a timber bridge with the modern equivalent as a concrete bridge is an awesome improvement both in terms of physical infrastructure & in terms of community & staff well being. It also resolves 'first mile' challenges.

I truly want the Australian Government to know how appreciative we are of this change.

Years ago, before that change, I asked our Council to find \$500k to match \$500k NDRRA funding to replace a timber bridge at Nerrigundah. Thankfully our Council agreed, somehow we found the funding & we were able to replace that bridge in concrete.

When the Black Summer bushfires came through, that bridge was the only bridge left standing & it provided the only access to the western sector of Eurobodalla. All other timber bridges were burnt to the ground or severely fire damaged.

To be able to replace the 18 lost timber bridges in concrete, and know our community will never face that circumstance again, is a massive blessing. So thank you!

#### 2. Tweaking NDRRA

With minor tweaks to NDRRA we could do so much better.

We have put concrete bridges back. If we'd been readily able to lift some of those bridges, marginally increase the span, then the on-going enhancements to flood access, reduced future road damage & reduced debris cleaning work would have been significant. The cost differential under the NDRRA would have been minor as a once off impact.

Yes we could have spent additional resource & time, built a case for betterment, applied to the State, had them negotiate with the Australian Government and hoped we would get an approval. But we're desperately trying to reconnect our community immediately. We have to remain focussed on that primary task. 16 new bridges of 20 will be complete by 30 June 2021 (one extra from flood damage, one extra resilience replacement).

I would ask your Department to help facilitate a positive change in NDRRA whereby if Councils can demonstrate the cost is less than 0-20% more, but brings significant resilience improvements, then this can automatically proceed with funding under NDRRA.

The pay-off would be reduced disconnection of communities, reduced infrastructure damage, reduced unplanned emergency works & reduced cost to Government under NDRRA in future natural disasters.

### 3. Climate & natural disaster resilience

The Australian Government has implemented some amazing stimulus funding for road safety.

Our community, local businesses and local contractors are benefitting from this program right now. Saving lives on-going in perpetuity & keeping many employed to offset the adverse COVID-19 impacts. This will also facilitate significant economic development along our major growth corridor.

This is extremely positive & should be continued.

Roads to recovery is already fully directed to sustaining our network. It brings road safety through many ways such as resurfacing roads to ensure good skid performance. Yet it is fully utilized.

But what of funding to undertake resilience improvement work. As I drive across our local road network I see a disconnected community, extensive damage, \$10M's of unplanned recovery work and a scarcity of resource to achieve the outcomes needed quickly.

Yet in all of that I also see huge opportunity. The damaged road reads like a map to an experienced Engineer. Yes there are elements where little could be done to prevent damage, but equally there are so many low cost solutions that could be done in a calm, planned way to drastically reduce future damage & reduce the burden on communities here & across Australia.

Local Government is a complex and highly variable level of Government. I am sure you already ask the question, how can the Australian Government cause Local Government to fulfill a National priority, in this case, building a more resilient future.

From a policy perspective, I'm going to be bold enough to suggest a way that the Australian Government can demonstrate greater intent in the adaptation to climate change and in the defense against future natural disasters. One simple policy change is to require round 3 of the LRCIP to be spent on making our local road infrastructure more resilient.

That directive from the Australian Government will more than pay for itself in reduced future NDRRA payments. But far more importantly, it would signal to disaster ravaged communities that the Australian Government has seen the trauma, it has listened and it has partnered directly with Local Government to make a real and significant difference.



As we undertake extensive and expensive recovery works, we have almost no ability to extend that work & take advantage of set-up, establishment costs & planning costs to complete resilience & stabilization work immediately adjoining already failed sections. The residual risk we carry are significant and remains a concern.

Perhaps you already have real resilience plans afoot in some other form.

I recognise I am just one voice, just one Engineer working & living through our shared community disaster experience. Yet I know the views expressed here are shared by so many colleagues wondering how can we bring about a positive change, asking where do we start, who do we talk to get that change?

My optimistic hope is you might consider this plea in the interest of future community resilience to save the level of disconnectedness we see every day in Eurobodalla and other regional communities across Australia.

#### **Event description**

As at 630am on 21 March 2021:

- There have been 6309 RFAs for this event from 10 March 2021 to 0400 on 21 March 2021.
- There are 525 teams in the field, including strike teams from FRNSW, RFS Ambulance and NSW Police Force.
- The NSW State Emergency Service State Command Centre is currently staffed with Planning, Intelligence, Aviation and Public Information Functions to support NSW SES Area of Operations.

## **NEW DISASTER RECOVERY FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS (DRFA) EVENT – NSW Storms and Floods (10 March 2021 onwards)**

Resilience NSW has submitted a formal DRFA notification for the storms and floods which occurred from 10 March 2021.

### **Event description**

- From 10 March, a coastal trough has resulted in prolonged heavy rainfall over the northern half of the NSW coast, which has intensified as a low-pressure system forms over the Mid-North Coast and tracks south.
  - This event has resulted in heavy rain, damaging winds and extensive flooding.
  - Flooding over roads and road closures have occurred across most LGAs.
  - Damage to residences and businesses have been recorded and closures of schools in the Bellingen, Coffs Harbour, Kempsey, Nambucca Valley, Port Macquarie-Hastings areas.
- There has been significant damage to essential public assets and more is expected, particularly in the Armidale, Bellingen, Clarence Valley, Coffs Harbour City, Dungog Shire, Kempsey, Lake Macquarie City, Mid-Coast, Nambucca, Port Macquarie-Hastings, Port Stephens, and Tenterfield LGAs.
- A significant and coordinated multi-agency response is required for this event:

- As of 6.30 am on 20 March 2021, evacuation centres have been established in the Port Macquarie, Kempsey, Mid-Coast, and Nambucca Valley LGAs, with further centres likely to open as the disaster progresses.
- Numerous evacuation warnings and orders have been issued across a number of LGAs
- As at 0630hrs on 20 March, the SES had received a total of 1926 Requests for Assistance (RFA's) during this event, including 278 flood rescue activations.
- Several regional SES Incident Management Teams have been established, with additional staff at the SES State Operations Centre for increased flood and storm operations.
- Aircraft have been pre-positioned in Coffs Harbour and Kempsey, with planning underway for aircraft support for the Sydney Metropolitan area.
- Additional resource planning continues to occur from across the State for Flood Rescue, Storm and IMT personnel.
- NSW SES is being supported by Liaison Officers from NSW Police, NSW Energy and Utility Services Functional Area (EUSFA), Transport NSW, NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS), Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW) and BOM Hydro.
- FRNSW, RFS, NSW Police, Ambulance NSW and Marine Rescue have supplied strike teams and personnel.

# FACTSHEET: Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements

## (Joint Australian-New South Wales government assistance)

### NSW Storms and Floods (10 March 2021 onwards) – V6

**\*Please note the information in this factsheet is current as at 14 July 2021 and may change\***

The Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) is a jointly funded program between the Australian Government and state and territory (state) governments, through which the Australian Government provides financial assistance to support state governments with disaster recovery costs. Eligible costs include assistance measures for individuals and families, businesses, primary producers, non-profit organisations and local and state governments.

Under these arrangements, state governments determine what assistance measures will be activated, and the areas in which they will be made available. The Australian Government may then reimburse state governments for up to 75 per cent of these costs. State governments are responsible for administering the DRFA assistance measures.

#### DRFA ACTIVATED LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

In response to the NSW storms and floods, DRFA assistance has been activated in the seventy-eight (78) local government areas of: Armidale, Ballina, Bathurst, Bega Valley, Bellingen, Brewarrina, Blacktown, Blue Mountains, Bogan, Byron, Cabonne, Camden, Campbelltown, Canterbury-Bankstown, Central Coast, Central Darling, Cessnock, Clarence Valley, Cobar, Coffs Harbour, Coonamble, Cumberland, Dungog, Eurobodalla, Fairfield, Georges River, Gilgandra, Glen Innes Severn, Greater Hume, Goulburn Mulwaree, Gunnedah, Gwydir, Hawkesbury, Hornsby, Hunters Hill, Inner West, Inverell, Kempsey, Ku-ring-gai, Kyogle, Lachlan, Lake Macquarie, Lismore, Lithgow, Liverpool, Liverpool Plains, Maitland, Mid-Coast, Moree Plains, Muswellbrook, Nambucca Valley, Narrabri, Narromine, Newcastle, Northern Beaches, Oberon, Parramatta, Penrith, Port Macquarie-Hastings, Port Stephens, Queanbeyan Palerang, Richmond Valley, Shoalhaven, Singleton, Snowy Monaro, Sutherland, Tamworth, Temora, Tenterfield, The Hills, Tweed, Upper Lachlan, Uralla, Walcha, Walgett, Warren, Wingecarribee, Wollondilly.

#### DRFA ASSISTANCE MEASURES (as activated by the New South Wales Government)

##### Assistance for individuals

Immediate assistance: This assistance is intended to meet the essential emergency needs of people who are directly affected by the disaster and have no other means of meeting their immediate needs (such as evacuees who are unable to access their personal finances or arrange alternative forms of assistance). The assistance may be provided during and in the days after the disaster. Assistance is provided through in-kind direct material aid e.g. emergency accommodation or small cash payments to purchase essential items. Immediate assistance is generally provided from evacuation or recovery centres.

Grants for essential household contents: These grants will assist with the cost of replacing household items essential to maintaining a basic standard of living. Examples of essential household contents include bedding, furniture, clothing, and essential electrical items (e.g. refrigerator, washing machine, stove). These grants assist low-income residents, not covered by insurance, who have no other means of restoring their homes to a safe and habitable condition following the disaster event. Grants are subject to income and assets testing. The amount of assistance provided depends on the assessed needs of the affected household and the number and type of items that have been damaged.

Grants for essential structural repairs to homes: These grants provide a contribution toward essential structural repairs to low income home owners who have no other means of restoring their homes to a safe and habitable condition following the disaster event, and who are not covered by insurance. Grants are subject to income and assets testing. The amount of assistance provided depends on an assessment of structural repairs required and the number of occupants in the home.

### Assistance for small businesses, primary producers and non-profit organisations

Recovery Grants for primary producers: Grants of up to \$75,000 are available to primary producers that have suffered direct damage to help cover eligible clean-up and reinstatement costs. The grants can be used for a range of activities including removing debris, cleaning-up, repairing damaged fencing and equipment, replacing livestock, salvaging crops and restoring fields.

- State administering agency: NSW Rural Assistance Authority
- Enquiry contact: NSW Rural Assistance Authority on 1800 678 593.

Recovery Grants for small businesses and non-profit organisations: Grants of up to \$50,000 are available to small businesses and non-profit organisations that have suffered direct damage to help cover eligible clean-up and reinstatement costs. The grants can be used for a range of activities including removing damaged goods, cleaning-up, repairing damaged fittings and equipment and replacing stock.

- State administering agency: Service NSW
- Enquiry contact: Service NSW on 13 77 88.

Concessional interest rate loans (direct damage) to small businesses and primary producers: Loans of up to \$130,000 at a fixed concessional interest rate may be available to small businesses and primary producers (subject to certain eligibility criteria) that have been directly impacted by a disaster. These loans may be used to meet carry-on requirements or to repair or replace damaged property not covered by insurance.

- State administering agency: NSW Rural Assistance Authority
- Enquiry contact: NSW Rural Assistance Authority on 1800 678 593.

Concessional interest rate loans (direct damage) and grants to non-profit organisations:

*Assistance to sporting and recreation clubs:* A special scheme is available to assist sporting and recreation clubs in meeting the costs of restoration of essential club facilities that have been damaged or destroyed. The assistance is only made available to clubs that do not have the financial capacity to meet restoration costs from their own resources, and who are unable to obtain assistance through normal channels, but that have the capacity to repay any loan that may be granted. The maximum assistance available is \$12,000, including a grant of up to \$2,000 and the balance by way of repayable advance with interest.

- State administering agency: NSW Treasury for grant assistance

*Loans to non-profit organisations:* Loan assistance is available to voluntary non-profit organisations for the restoration of essential facilities that have been damaged or destroyed. Assistance is only available to those organisations that do not have the financial capacity to meet restoration costs from their own resources or insurance and are unable to obtain assistance through normal channels. Advances are subject to a maximum of \$25,000 at a concessional interest rate per annum.

*Freight subsidies for primary producers:* Transport freight subsidies of up to 50 per cent on the carriage of livestock and fodder, and 25 per cent on the carriage of fodder for dairy cattle, are available to help primary producers. The maximum subsidy available is \$15,000 per annum.

### Assistance for state agencies and local councils

Counter disaster operations: This assistance helps state agencies and councils with the costs associated with delivering exceptional relief and recovery measures within impacted communities which go beyond the capacity of the state or local government. This may include activities to render damaged properties or threatened houses safe and habitable, sandbagging and the construction of temporary levees to prevent inundation of residential properties.

Restoration of essential public assets: This measure provides financial assistance to help with the costs of restoring or repairing eligible essential public assets damaged as a direct result of a disaster to their pre-disaster standard.

  - For assistance to restore public roads, road infrastructure and bridges, councils should contact their regional representatives in Transport for NSW.
  - For assistance to restore other essential public assets, councils should contact their regional representatives in Public Works Advisory.

### Other Assistance

The NSW Government may also claim costs associated with certain other disaster assistance measures undertaken by state agencies and councils including the establishment and operation of evacuation and recovery centres, personal and financial counselling services, engagement of community recovery officers and debris removal from residential properties.

Additional assistance has been activated for this disaster including:

**NSW Storm and Flood Clean-up Package:** A clean-up package to assist households, businesses, primary producers and local councils affected by the floods. The clean-up covers both insured and uninsured properties and assists with the clean-up and restoration of flood damaged, priority environmental assets.

- State administering agency: NSW Environmental Protection Authority and Public Works Advisory
- Enquiry contact: Service NSW on 13 77 88 or local council.

**NSW Flood Industry Recovery Package:** This package will provide targeted funding for the agriculture, aquaculture and horticulture industries to support immediate and longer-term recovery needs and the retention of jobs for eligible producers and businesses.

**Community Infrastructure Repair Program:** This package will provide targeted community infrastructure repair and renewal in partnership with local councils in high to severely impacted disaster declared LGAs. Eligible infrastructure includes libraries, youth centres, childcare centres, senior citizen centres, public toilets, parks and playgrounds.

**\$10,000 Rural Landholder Grants:** These grants are to reimburse eligible rural landholders not covered by insurance and who do not qualify for existing recovery grants, for the cost of clean-up activities, losses or damages beyond the vicinity of the residential dwelling.

**Riverbank restoration:** This program will assist private landowners, NSW Government agencies and councils to ensure post-flood remediation works on riverbanks can be done quickly, are appropriate and consistent with government policy and regulations, and will support the long-term health of the rivers.

**Mental Health and Community Wellbeing Program:** This funding will provide targeted mental health resources and support for Aboriginal communities and children and young people impacted by the storms and floods.

**Jenolan Caves Restoration:** This funding will support the Jenolan Caves Reserve Trust to restore damaged environmental assets and in some cases, rebuild them to a more resilient standard.

**Local Recovery Resources:** This funding is for severely impacted councils to engage a designated flood Community Recovery Officer for up to 24 months to deliver community-based recovery initiatives and assist people to navigate and access recovery support.

**Volunteer/Not for Profit Organisations:** This funding is to support volunteer organisations to purchase fencing material and equipment to support rural fencing programs in flood-affected communities.

**Infrastructure Betterment Fund:** The Commonwealth and NSW Governments have also announced a joint \$200 million Infrastructure Betterment Fund to support the reconstruction and improved disaster resilience of public assets damaged during the February and March storms as well as the 2019-20 bushfires. This will enable local and state governments in NSW to restore and rebuild essential infrastructure—including roads, bridges, schools and hospitals—to a more resilient standard to better withstand future disasters.
